Dear Kindergarten Families

Here are some ways to support your child to be ready for kindergarten at home. Please take the time to allow your child to practice the following skills to help with their transition into Kindergarten. If your child does require assistance, please help them as minimally as possible to build independence in that task. Remember, learning new skills requires time and patience!

- Putting on, taking off, hanging up, and zipping jacket
- Getting undressed and dressed independently, especially belts and buttons to reduce accidents when using the restroom.
- Writing their first name.
- Tying their shoes
- Washing hands using soap and warm water
- Opening their lunch box and any included containers
- Feeding themselves independently
- Using scissors correctly
