LUSD9 is currently utilizing an in-person instruction model and will maintain that model throughout the school year. LUSD9 will emphasize the use of adopted and recommended sanitizing procedures and social distancing guidelines in accordance with CDC Recommended health and safety guidelines.

The plan includes a model for in-person instruction, tiered academic interventions, and support for students in their learning gaps as well as ensuring our curriculum addresses all students in their various learning targets.

29. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

The district has provided training and support to all staff in the area of social and emotional learning and trauma-informed practices. Our mental health counselors will meet to provide direct services to students and collaborate with local providers in meeting the overall wellbeing of our students.

30. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' other needs?*

This may include student health and food services.

Through past participation in the summer food program, our district provided meals to students throughout the summer and many of the non-school days we have had. Working together with our county health department regarding health, nutrition, and drug abuse education programs is an additional support we offer our students.

31. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for staff's social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

The district has provided training and support to all staff in their own needs. Support has been provided through a social worker and through information about services available through our health insurance.

32. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for staff's other needs?*

Instructional support has been provided through the district's contracting with a consultant who is in the school twice a month. Support for new teachers is offered through participation in a new teacher mentoring program grant.
